## **Ecological Implications of Heavy Metals** in Insects and Lizards in Los Angeles County, CA

Loyola Marymount University Summer 2015 - Present

Ecology, lead researcher under supervision of Dr. Victor Carmona 120 hours

The objective of this study was to investigate how the metals are accumulated and dispersed in the Ballona Wetlands and what effects this might posit on invertebrates and vertebrates at the individual, intraspecies, and interspecies level. Summer field work involved intensive problem solving and cooperative work. Laboratory work involved working together with fragile and expensive technology, including the use of an inductively coupled plasma mass spectrometer. Research was presented at the 2016 LMU Research Symposium, and paper editing will be performed this Summer for submission for publishing in scientific journals.

## **CPR Knowledge of Latino Farmworkers** in Southern California

## The Effects of Sleep on Cognitive Function and Examination Performance

**Loyola Marymount University Spring 2016 - Present** 

Physics-Biology Co-Op, co-lead researcher under supervision of Dr. Vincent Coletta 40 hours

The objective of this study was to investigate the relationship between reported sleep and test performance of college students in a general physics class. Research consisted of weekly meetings and collaboration with a student and professor of the LMU Physics Department. Quantity of sleep before exams, as well as class exam, scientific reasoning, and spatial reasoning scores were collected from an entry level physics course for life science majors. I presented the research at the 2016 LMU Research Symposium and will be presenting it in July at the 2016 Physics Education Research Conference in Sacramento, California.

# California Horn Snail exhibit a bimodal size distribution and size-associated dispersion patterns

Ecology, co-lead researcher under supervision of Dr. Victor Carmona 40 hours

The goal of the study was to investigate the population dynamics of the California Horn Snail in Ballona Wetlands, California, an ecological reserve that is scheduled for restoration within the next few years. The experiments focused on the spatial dispersion, size distribution, and density of *C. californica* collected from the Ballona Wetlands Ecological Preserve. Research involved working with others to plan, organize, and execute research procedures both in the field and in the laboratory. Analysis of data required cooperative use of statistical software. Research was presented at the 2016 LMU Research Symposium, and paper editing is currently underway for submission for publishing in scientific journals.
