Use the five DNA sequences/parts that are available via the BE.180 wiki [http://openwetware.org/wiki/BE.180].

What will this composite part do when placed inside a living bacterium?

Q2. Finding open reading frames (25% of grade).

Write a computer program that finds all open reading frames (ORFs) in a sequence of DNA and outputs the DNA sequences of any found ORFs to a text file. For this problem, ORFs are defined as stretches of DNA that start with the sequence "atg," stop with the sequence "taa," and are at least 50 base pairs long. Run this program on the final DNA sequence produced by your Q1 program.
